Pay Increase for Police Department Employee – Police Chief Colclasure has sent a letter to the Mayor Moore and the Council to propose a rate increase from \$34.33/hour to \$36.52/hour for Assistant Chief Ben Lewis. This was the rate previously held by the former Assistant Chief. Assistant Lewis completed his first year of service with the Fairfield Police Department on June 14, 2024 and this rate increase would be a recognition of his hard work and the value he has brought to the department. A motion was made by Alderman Dewey Eckleberry, seconded by Alderman Attebery to approve the pay increase for Assistant Chief Ben Lewis.

Miscellaneous – Mayor Moore reminded everyone about a public hearing with the Department of Natural Resources that is scheduled on July 8th at 6:30 p.m. to discuss the Pond Creek Watershed Project at Lakeside. Mayor Moore hopes to be able to put water back in the lake. The engineers are finalizing the cost of the project and hopefully we can get some matching federal grants for funding this project.

Miscellaneous – Attorney Rice gave an update on three properties that we are awaiting final judgment permitting the city to demolish the structures. These properties are located on NW 5th, Walker Street, and Mt. Vernon Rd. Everyone has been served and he hopes to hear back from the court soon. Mayor Moore reminded the Council that as those judgments come through and we get permission to demolish the buildings, the Council will be asked to approve the fundings to front the cost of demolition. Attorney Rice stated there is a chance we could go after the individuals to get them to pay the city back for the demolition and the attorney fees. If not, we would have to file a lien against the property.
