Proclamation for Adult Education and Family Literacy Week – Angel Maguire with Frontier  
College spoke to the Council about Adult Education and Family Literacy Week. Mayor Moore  
had previously signed a proclamation for Literacy Week and Mrs. Maguire thanked the Council  
and the City for promoting and supporting IECC in what they do and provide.

Resolution for a Revolving Loan to Samantha Baker d/b/a 618-JUAN-8 Bakery, LLC –  
Samantha Baker told the Council that she has purchased a building downtown and she and her  
husband plan to open a bakery there. The building needs a lot of renovation. They need to make  
the building ADA compliant, relocate water and sewer lines, and the building needs electrical

upgrades. She is asking for Council approval of a revolving loan in the amount of \$30,000. A motion was made by Alderman Dewey Eckleberry, seconded by Alderman Attebery to approve this loan.

Purchase of a Dump Truck for the Cemetery Department – We have received a bid for the purchase of a dump truck for the cemetery department. The truck they have has many problems and they are in need of a more reliable vehicle. Alderman Stahl saw a used dump truck in Effingham for sale and is recommending we check out this truck to see if it is still available before we commit to buying a new one. Other aldermen were in agreement and Mayor Moore tabled this purchase until the used truck can be looked at.

Purchase of a Dump Bed for Street & Bridge Department – The Street & Bridge Department needs a new dump bed to put on the 2001 International truck. The current bed needs to be replaced. Vaughan Equipment Inc. has given us a price in the amount of \$17,039.33. A motion was made by Alderman Stahl, seconded by Alderman McKibben to approve the purchase of a dump bed from Vaughan Equipment Inc. in the amount of \$17,039.33

Discussion Concerning Front Yard Fencing – The City has a zoning ordinance that states front yard fencing cannot be higher than 30 inches. We have a resident that has requested to build a fence taller than that because he has a child with medical issues and needs the fence to be tall enough so he cannot step over the fence. Mayor Moore recommends that we allow our residents to go to the zoning board and request a special exemption. All of the aldermen agreed with Mayor Moore's recommendation.

Recreation Fund Expenditure Request – The recreation committee has requested the expenditure of \$3,000 for various activities. They have requested \$225.00 for Trunk or Treat, \$700.00 for the Holiday Open House, and \$600.00 for the Christmas Parade. They are also asking for \$375.00 for a speaker and microphone and \$1,100.00 for electrical upgrades for downtown. A motion was made by Alderman Reeve, seconded by Alderman Sheryl Eckleberry to approve this request.
